IMMIGRATION PROCEDURES

Necessary Documents

• Passport

Your passport, issued by your home country, must be valid for at least six months beyond your planned stay in the U.S.

• I-94 Card (Arrival/Departure Document)

Each time you enter the U.S., the Immigration Official at your port of entry will give you a new I-94 Card. The I-94 is stamped to indicate how long you may remain in the U.S. (It should not be confused with the visa, which only authorizes permission to attempt entry into the U.S.) **This is your proof of legal entry into the country. Each time you receive a new I-94 card, you must submit a copy of the front and back to the Center for International Education.**

• Visa

A valid U.S. visa is required to enter the United States. To apply for a U.S. visa, you must present your documents at a U.S. embassy or consulate outside the U.S.

Documents needed to apply for a J-1 Visa include:

- Passport
- DS-2019
- Proof of Financial Support-amount is indicated on the DS-2019
- Proof of intention to return to your home country
- Two passport type photographs
- A Nonimmigrant Visa Application and fee
- University admission letter and catalog
- A receipt of your SEVIS fee payment (www.fmjfee.com)

Check with your local embassy or consulate for their specific procedures.

Note: J-1 visa holders are permitted entry to the U.S. up to 30 days prior to the programs start date listed on your DS-2019.

DO NOT ENTER THE U.S. ON A B-1/B-2 VISITOR VISA, as it is difficult to change here in the U.S unless you tell the U.S. embassy/consulate and the Immigration Officials at your port of entry that you plan to study here and will be deciding on a school. Ask for your visa and **I-94** card (given to you at arrival port of entry) to be marked with “prospective student.” This will help you change status within the U.S. Otherwise you will be required to leave the U.S. before the expiration date on your I-94 card.

Visas for Third Country Nationals (TCN)

TCN visa applicants (someone applying for a visa outside their home country) will have more difficulties when applying for a visa. Consular officers will deny visas whenever they believe there are fraud indications present, or their lack of knowledge of local conditions and familiarity with documents in the applicant's home country prevents them from properly adjudicating the case. Applications will not be accepted from nationals of countries currently designated as state sponsors of terrorism. For more information go to: <http://travel.state.gov/travel/tcn.html>.

Special Note for Canadian Students: Non-immigrants traveling on a Canadian passport are not required to have a visa and may enter the U.S. with only a valid Form I-20 and passport.

HOUSING

ON-CAMPUS HOUSING

Exchange students apply for housing through the Center for International Education. **Please make sure to enclose your Application for On-Campus Housing form along with your university application and return them as soon as possible.** The housing fee (for those pre-paying housing costs to CCSU) is:

- Standard Residential Halls (double-occupancy) \$2,654.00/semester*
- James Hall (double-occupancy suite of 3-4 bedrooms) \$3,182.00/semester*

*Students who pay for housing at the home university and choose to live in **James Hall** MUST pay the upgrade fee of \$528.00. **Full payment for on campus housing is due to the bursar no later than JULY 15, 2009.**

This will provide you with the information you need to select the best residence hall for you. **Residence Life does not provide any linens or pillows.** We will have a shuttle service operating the weekend of orientation so that you can purchase these supplies at a local department store.

Students remaining on the campus during Spring Break will be charged \$70.00 for the week.

OFF-CAMPUS HOUSING

Off-campus housing in the surrounding community is available to international students however, you are responsible to find your own off-campus housing. The Center for International Education recommends that you allow at least one week to secure off-campus housing. Unfortunately, temporary housing is not available at CCSU for students living off-campus during the semester. Other off-campus listings are available at the Office of Residence Life in Barrows Hall.

Meal plan

Students living on-campus are required to purchase a meal plan. This is paid on a semester basis. The "TrueBlue" meal plan is **\$1,907.00 per semester.*** This plan gives you unlimited access to the student cafeteria.

Meals are served three times a day in Memorial Hall, Monday - Friday, while only Brunch and Dinner are served on Saturday and Sunday. Meals may not be available during certain holidays.

Students living Off-Campus can purchase meals in the Cafeteria.

What are Blue Chip Dollars? This is part of the campus debit card system which provides you with the opportunity to use that money towards a variety of campus services and at approved off-campus retail stores and restaurants.

Note: Exchange students are permitted to work only on-campus, although on-campus employment is not guaranteed.

Central Pipeline

This on-line system links you to the university. It can be used to:

- Set up and access your CCSU email account from home
- Register on-line for your classes (J-1 exchange students register with the CIE for classes)
- Review your class schedule
- View and pay current bills

To access this system go to www.ccsu.edu/pipeline. You will need to provide the following information:

- Your 8-digit CCSU ID number
- Your Birth Date (mm/dd/yyyy)
- The last 4 numbers of your “alternate placeholder number” (social security number) assigned to you by CCSU. If you do not know your alternate placeholder number, you can contact the Center for International Education or the CCSU Registrar’s Office for help.

Once you have all this information, enter Pipeline, click on the left hand entry – “Do you need” Your response should be: A Bluenet Account. Follow the instructions provided from this point.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PAYING YOUR BILL

CCSU uses a QUICK PAY system to pay for all tuition and fees, please refer to this when trying to make a payment.

Instructions for accessing QuikPAY:

- Set up BlueNet ID, CentralPipeline and e-mail account at <http://accounts.ccsu.edu>
- Log onto Central Pipeline (<http://pipeline.ccsu.edu>) using your BlueNet ID and password, then click on Student tab
- EBill / Make QuikPAY Payment (from menu on left)
- View Account
- Current Statement (from drop down list on the right)
- The Payment Options and Central Payment Plan forms can be found on the third page pdf copy of the Current Statement (click on "PDF" icon).
- You will also have the option of setting up one or more authorized payers within QuikPAY who will also receive email notification of the bill.

Registration

The CIE International Education Coordinator will pre-register you for the first semester, based on your Course Selection Form (which should be mailed along with your application to the university). Exchange students do not pay the \$200 confirmation fee.

Medical Forms

NOTE: You may be prevented from registering for classes, making changes to your registration or living in campus housing without a completed Health Form. We urge you to have your physical, and complete the Health Form BEFORE coming to CCSU.

Remember to bring information from home on any preexisting conditions and the supply of medication that you will need for your stay.

NOTE: Health Services may require additional immunizations/tests to be completed upon arrival in the U.S. Please refer to the Health Form or contact Health Services at:

www.ccsu.edu/healthservice for specific details.

Student Insurance

Student health insurance is **required** for all full-time students, which is an additional \$473.00 per semester.*

***Special Note for Exchange (J-1) Students:**

You have the option of waiving the medical portion, but not the \$107.50 accident portion, of the CCSU insurance coverage if you have an individual policy that meets University requirements. The insurance policy must have equal or better coverage than CCSU insurance which is \$50,000.00. The insurance company must have an office located in the U.S.

If you want to waive CCSU's medical insurance, you must bring documentation and the address of the insurance company to Nancy Weissmann in the CIE office upon arrival.

WHEN TO ARRIVE AT THE UNIVERSITY

The Center for International Education recommends that you arrive in the United States by **August 26th, 2009**.

Please fax the Travel Information Form to the CIE office at 860 832-2047 by August 3, 2009, so that we can make appropriate arrangements for your arrival.

YOU MUST ARRIVE at CCSU on **August 27th** **BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 8:30am-3:30pm**. A member of the CIE staff will be available to assist you with moving into your Residence Hall. The identification card necessary to enter the dormitory can only be issued during this time period. The CIE office is located in Barnard Hall, Room 123.

NOTE: If for some reason you arrive after 3:30 PM, residence life staff will be available to assist you in Barrows Hall between 6:00 and 9:00 PM.

YOUR LUGGAGE

Keep all important documents, in your carry-on luggage! If your luggage is lost or delayed, give the airline the following address:

Make sure to check the weight limit for your luggage for your flight to the U.S. You will have to pay extra for overweight luggage or you will need to remove items at the airport in order to comply with weight restrictions. Don't forget that *you* need to lift your luggage on a cart or carry it short distances, so make sure it's not too heavy!

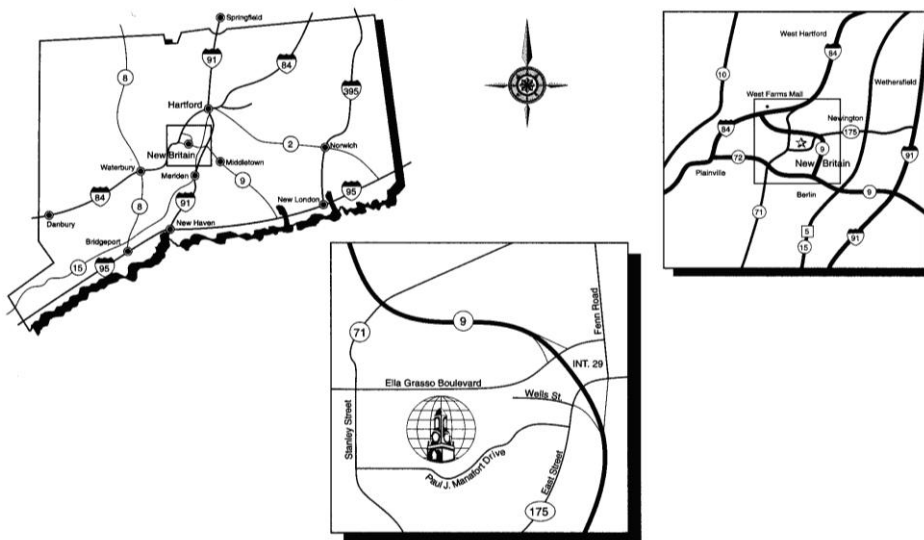
From the North: Take I-91 South to I-84 West to Exit 39A, to Rt. 9 South. Take Exit 29 off Rt. 9 South to Ella Grasso Boulevard. Turn right at the lights.

From the South (New York area): Take I-95 North to I-91 North to Exit 22 North to Rt. 9 North. Follow Rt. 9 to Exit 29, Cedar Street (Rt. 175). At the traffic light at the end of the ramp, turn left. On the second traffic light turn right onto Paul Manafort Drive.

From the South (Rhode Island area): Take I-95 South to Rt. 9 (Old Saybrook). Take Rt. 9 North to Exit 29, Cedar Street (Rt. 175). At the traffic light at the end of the ramp, turn left. On the second traffic light turn right onto Paul Manafort Drive.

From the East: Take I-84 West to Exit 39A to Rt. 9 South. Take Exit 29 off of Rt. 9 to Ella Grasso Boulevard. Turn right at the lights.

From the West: Take I-84 East to Exit 39A, to Rt. 9 South. Take Exit 29 off of Rt. 9 South to Ella Grasso Boulevard. Turn right at the lights. *Alternate Route:* Take I-84 East to Exit 35, Rt. 72 East (New Britain Exit). Follow Rt. 72 East to Rt. 9 North and take Exit 29 to Cedar Street (Rt. 175). GENERAL INFORMATION

GETTING A LOCAL BANK ACCOUNT

CCSU has on-campus bank called Achieve Financial, located in the bookstore area of the Student Center. You may open your account at this location on-campus and will be supplied with personal checks, as well as an Automated Teller Machine (ATM) card.

DRIVING IN THE U.S.

If you want to drive in the United States and already have a foreign driver's license, you may apply in your home country for an International Driver's Permit (IDP). The International Driver's Permit is valid only for one year in the U.S. The International Driver's Permit must be accompanied by your valid foreign driver's license from your home country. Paperwork for applying for a US driver's license will be available during orientation and in the CIE.

WORKING IN THE U.S.

J-1 visa holders are eligible for on-campus employment only. Availability of on-campus jobs is not guaranteed.

APPLY FOR A SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER (SSN)

F-1 and J-1 visa holders, with an offer of on-campus employment, are eligible to apply for a Social Security Number. Paperwork for applying for a SSN is available at the CIE.

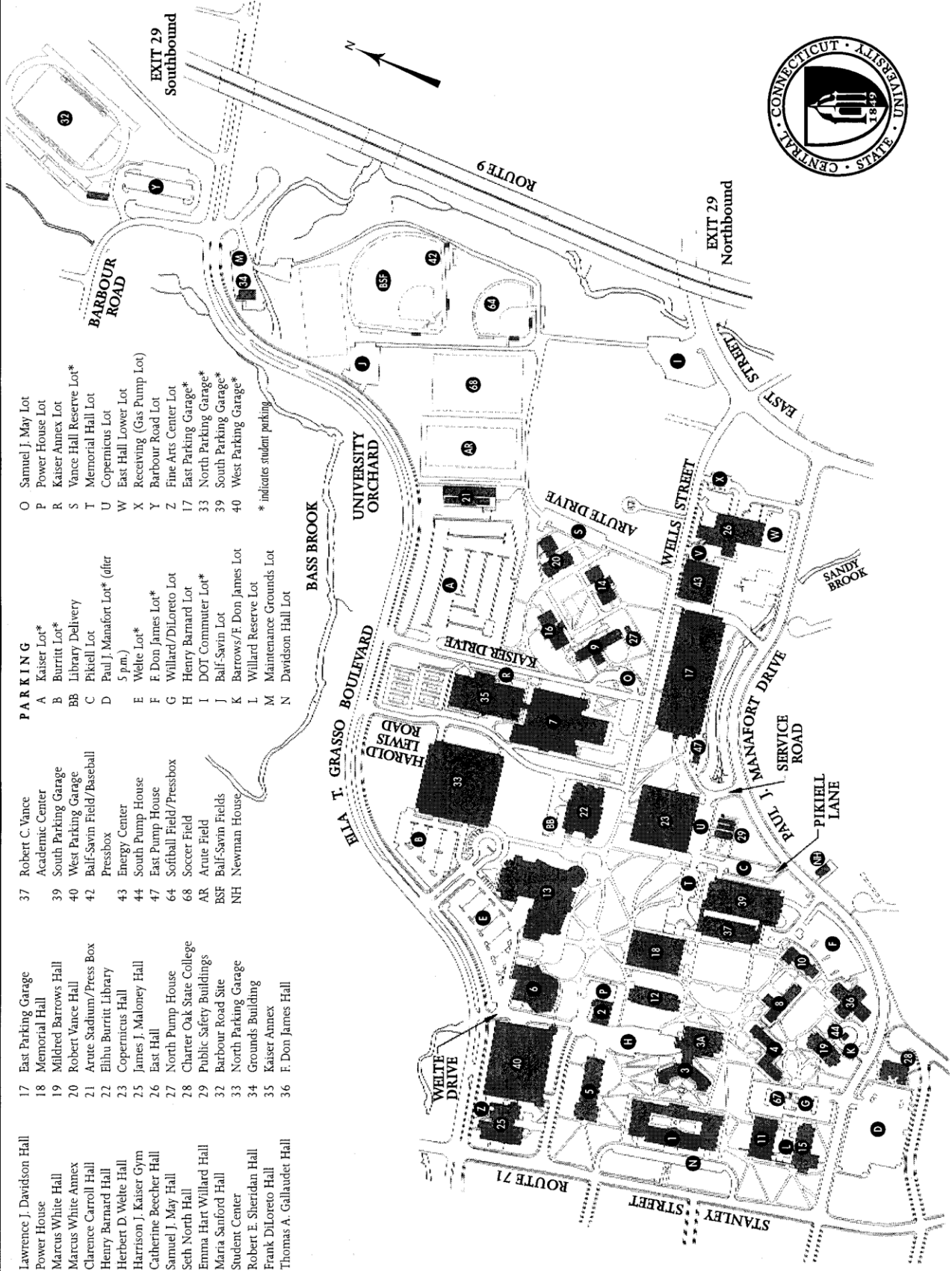
