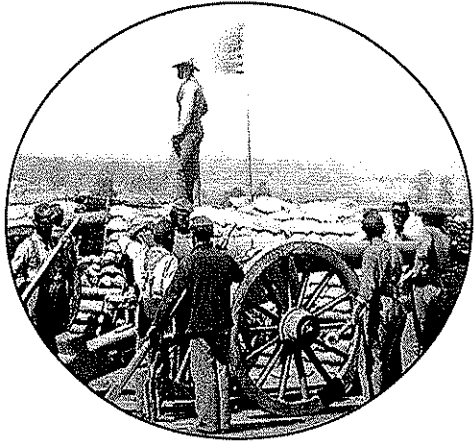

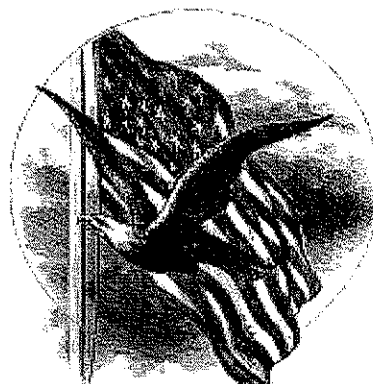
THE POPULATION IN 1860 WAS 1,216 (RANK 119)

More soldiers credited to Bozrah were listed as casualties (8) on this day than on any other day of the war. Eight soldiers were captured in the 18TH Connecticut. One died in prison.

The date June 15, 1863 ranks 2ND for total casualties (595) (23 killed, 11 wounded, 520 captured, 41 wounded & captured) for a single day for the State of Connecticut. There were 592 casualties at Winchester, VA and 3 casualties at Port Hudson, LA.

The Second Battle of Winchester (June 13-15) ranks 5TH for total casualties (592) for an engagement for the State of Connecticut. The most intense fighting was on June 15. Bozrah had all its casualties on that day.

The Second Battle of Winchester with 8 total casualties for Bozrah was the highest number of casualties for any single engagement of the war for the town.

Winchester was one of the most contested locations in the Civil War. It changed hands seventy-two times.

THREE WERE KILLED

The first Bozrah soldier killed was Private Thomas Lawlor of Company H, 11TH Connecticut. He was killed at the Battle of Antietam, MD on September 17, 1862.

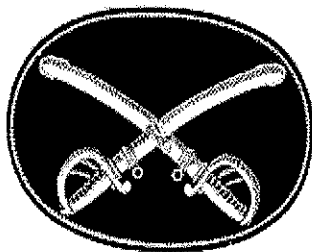

EIGHT WERE WOUNDED

The first Bozrah soldier wounded was Sergeant John Brown of Company H, 11TH Connecticut. He was wounded at the Battle of Antietam, MD on September 17, 1862 and recovered from his wound. Three Bozrah soldiers died from wounds received during the war.
