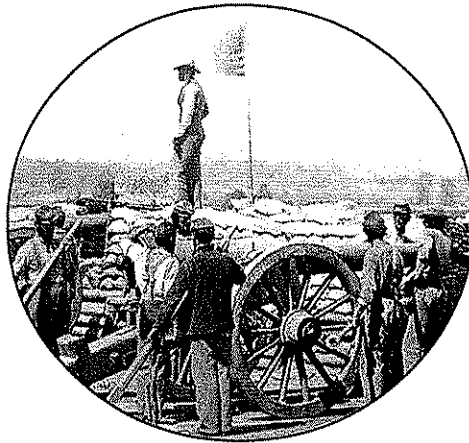

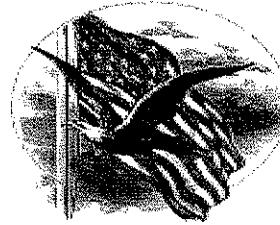
THE POPULATION IN 1860 WAS 2,373 (RANK 59)

More soldiers credited to Farmington were listed as casualties (22) on this day than on any other day of the war. Twenty-two soldiers in the 16TH Connecticut were captured. Nine of them eventually died in southern prisons.

The date April 20, 1864 ranks 6TH for total casualties (433) (1 killed, 2 missing, 12 wounded & captured, 418 captured) for a single day for the State of Connecticut. All of the casualties were at Plymouth, NC.

The Battle of Plymouth (April 20, 1864) ranks 9TH for total casualties (433) for an engagement for the State of Connecticut. Nearly half of all soldiers captured at Plymouth died in Southern prisons

The Battle of Plymouth with 22 total casualties for Farmington was the highest number of casualties for any single engagement of the war for the town.

When Confederate General Robert Hoke surrounded and captured the Union garrison at Plymouth, NC the Southern victory was the first in this military arena in quite some time. With aid from the two-gun ironclad *Albemarle* the Confederates were able to take advantage of the lack of suitable Union gunboats.

SEVEN WERE KILLED

The first Farmington soldier killed was Private Timothy Gladden of Company G, 16th Connecticut. He was killed at the Battle of Antietam, MD on September 17, 1862.

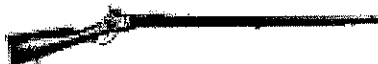

FORTY-SIX WERE CAPTURED

Twelve Farmington soldiers died in captivity. Five soldiers died at Andersonville Prison, GA, four at Florence Prison, SC, two at Libby Prison, Richmond, VA and one at Charleston Prison, SC.

FORTY-NINE WERE WOUNDED

The first Farmington soldier wounded was Private John Manion of Company E, 7th Connecticut. He was wounded at James Island, SC on June 16, 1862 and recovered from his wound. Six Farmington soldiers died from a wound received during the war.
