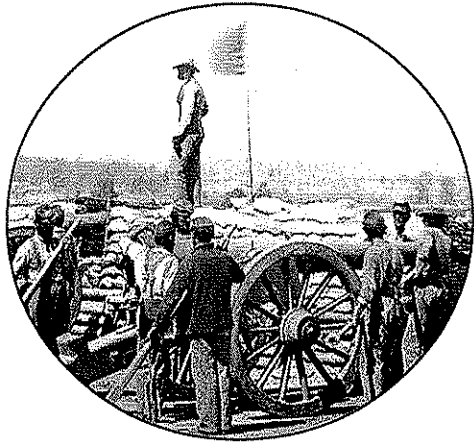

BATTLE OF WINCHESTER

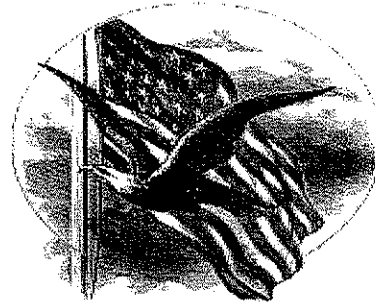
More soldiers credited to Griswold were listed as casualties (13) on this day than on any other day of the war. Eleven soldiers were captured, and 2 were wounded & captured in the 18TH Connecticut. All survived the war.

The date June 15, 1863 ranks 2ND for total casualties (595) (23 killed, 11 wounded, 520 captured, 41 wounded & captured) for a single day for the State of Connecticut. There were 592 casualties at Winchester, VA, and 3 casualties at Port Hudson, LA.

The Second Battle of Winchester (June 13-15, 1863) ranks 5TH for total casualties (592) for an engagement for the State of Connecticut. The most intense fighting was on June 15. Griswold had all its casualties on that day.

The Second Battle of Winchester with 13 total casualties for Griswold was the highest number of casualties for any single engagement of the war for the town.

Winchester was one of the most contested locations in the Civil War. It changed hands seventy-two times.

THREE WERE KILLED

The first Griswold soldier killed was Sergeant Charles E. Lewis of Company F, 8TH Connecticut. He was killed at the Battle of Antietam, MD on September 17, 1862.

THIRTY-SEVEN WERE WOUNDED

The first Griswold soldier wounded was Private Robert McClure of Company B, 5TH Connecticut. He was wounded at Cedar Mountain, VA on August 9, 1862 and recovered from his wound. Six Griswold soldiers died from a wound received during the war.
