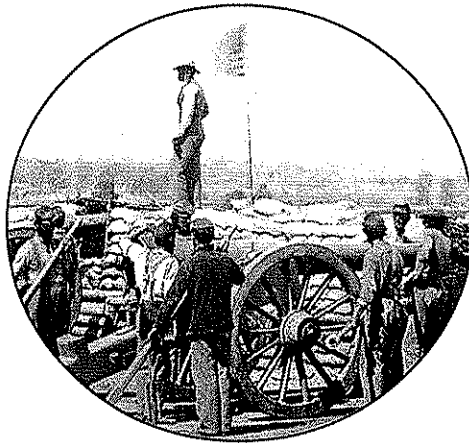

DAY OF THE CIVIL WAR

JUNE 15, 1863

WINCHESTER

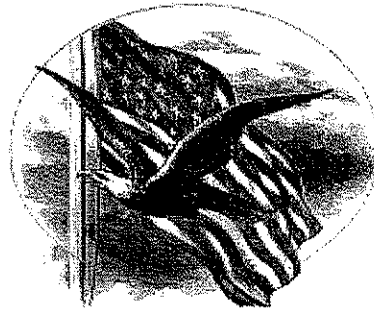
More soldiers credited to Lebanon were listed as casualties (24) on this day than on any other day of the war. Two soldiers were killed, 2 wounded & captured and 20 captured in the 18TH Connecticut. All of the wounded and captured survived the war.

The date June 15, 1863 ranks 2ND for total casualties (595) (23 killed, 11 wounded, 520 captured, 41 wounded & captured) for a single day for the State of Connecticut. There were 592 casualties at Winchester, VA and 3 casualties at Port Hudson, LA.

The Second Battle of Winchester (June 13-15, 1863) ranks 5TH for total casualties (592) for an engagement for the State of Connecticut. The most intense fighting developed on June 15. Lebanon had all its casualties on that day.

The Second Battle of Winchester with 24 total casualties for Lebanon was the highest number of casualties for any single engagement of the war for the town.

Winchester was one of the most contested locations in the Civil War. It changed hands seventy-two times.

The first Lebanon soldiers killed were Privates Asher D. Holmes and Henry McCracken of the 18TH Connecticut. They were killed at Winchester, VA on June 15, 1863.

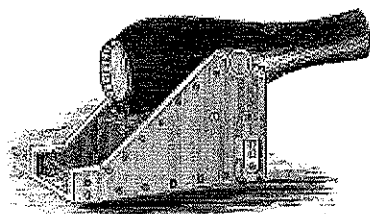

**THIRTY-TWO WERE WOUNDED**

The first Lebanon soldier wounded was Private Diodate J. Mitchell of Company D, 8TH Connecticut. He was wounded at Bolivar Heights, VA on September 14, 1862 and died from his wound. Five Lebanon soldiers died from a wound received during the war.
