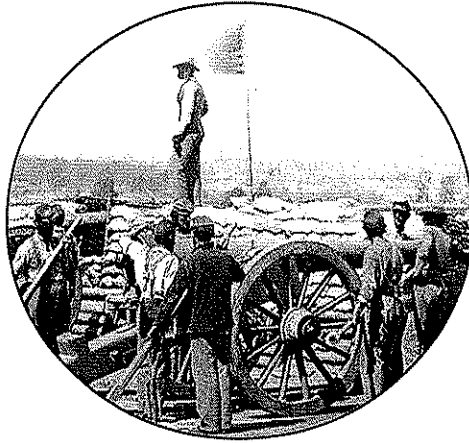

THE MOST IMPORTANT DAY
OF THE CIVIL WAR

JUNE 15 1863

WINCHESTER, VA

THE ENTIRE UNION ARMY
WAS NEARLY CAPTURED AT
THE SECOND
BATTLE OF WINCHESTER

More soldiers credited to Norwich were listed as casualties (170) on this day than on any other day of the war. Four soldiers were killed, 4 were wounded, 146 were captured, and 16 were wounded & captured in the 18TH Connecticut. Five soldiers died in captivity and 2 others died from wounds

The date June 15, 1863 ranks 2ND for total casualties (595) (23 killed, 11 wounded, 520 captured, 41 wounded & captured) for a single day for the State of Connecticut. There were 592 casualties at Winchester, VA and 3 casualties at Port Hudson, LA.

The Second Battle of Winchester (June 13-15, 1863) ranks 5TH for total casualties (592) for an engagement for the State of Connecticut. The most intense fighting was on June 15. Norwich had all its casualties on that day.

The Second Battle of Winchester with 169 total casualties for Norwich was the highest number of casualties for any single engagement of the war for the city.

Winchester was one of the most contested locations in the Civil War. It changed hands seventy-two times.

FORTY-FIVE WERE KILLED

The first Norwich soldier killed was Private David C. Case of Company D, 3RD Connecticut. He was killed at the Battle of Bull Run, VA on July 21, 1861

TWO HUNDRED-THIRTY SEVEN WERE CAPTURED

Twenty-seven Norwich soldiers died in captivity. Twelve died at Andersonville Prison, GA, three died at Winchester, VA, three died at Florence, SC, two died at Salisbury, NC, two died at Libby Prison, Richmond, VA, two died at Millen, GA, one died at Danville, VA, one died at Piedmont, VA, and one died at Staunton, VA.

TWO HUNDRED-THIRTEEN WERE WOUNDED

The first Norwich soldiers wounded were Privates John Bred and Joseph Stokes of the 1ST and 3RD Connecticut. They were wounded at the Battle of Bull Run on July 21, 1861 and Private Stokes died from his wound. Twenty-four Norwich soldiers died from a wound received during the war.
