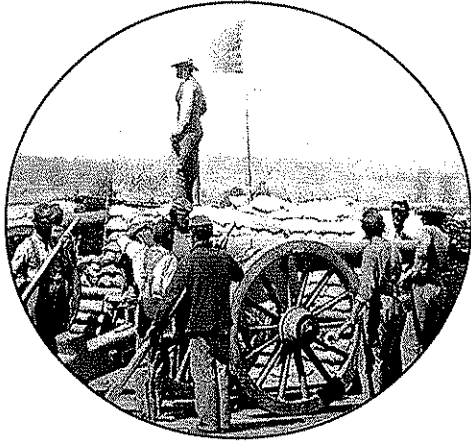

THE MOST IMPORTANT DAY OF THE CIVIL WAR

MAY 3, 1863

CHANCELLORSVILLE, VA

THE THIRD DAY OF THE BATTLE

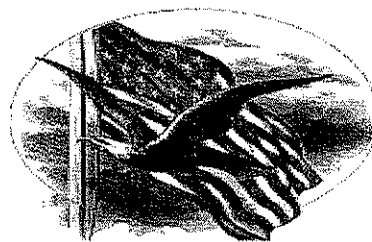
More soldiers credited to Wallingford were listed as casualties (13) on this day than any other day of the war. One soldier was wounded and 12 were captured in the 27TH Connecticut. They survived the war.

The date May 3, 1863 ranks 3RD for total casualties (577) (36 killed, 1 missing, 138 wounded, 372 captured, 29 wounded & captured) for a single day for the State of Connecticut. The most casualties were at Chancellorsville, VA (556). The other casualties were at Providence Church Road, VA (12), Suffolk, VA (6), Port Hudson, LA (2) and Fredericksburg, VA (1).

The Battle of Chancellorsville (May 1-3, 1863) ranks 2ND for total casualties (677) for an engagement for the State of Connecticut. The most intense fighting developed on May 3. Wallingford had no other casualties in the battle other than on May 3.

The Battle of Chancellorsville with 13 total casualties for Wallingford was the highest number of casualties for any single engagement of the war for the town.

The Battle of Chancellorsville was an enormous defeat for the more than 70,000 Union soldiers who had moved against the flank and rear of 40,000 Confederate soldiers. Unfortunately, the Union Army had pulled back and had gone on the defensive around Chancellorsville. The Confederate victory was tainted however, by the loss of Confederate Major General "Stonewall" Jackson.

SIX WERE KILLED

The first Wallingford soldier killed was Private George V. Dagle of Company K, 8TH Connecticut. He was killed at the Battle of Antietam, MD on September 17, 1862.

THIRTY WERE CAPTURED

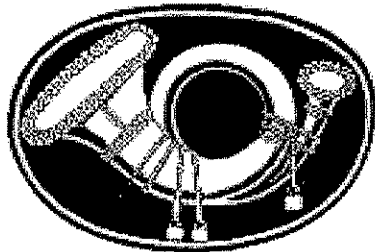
Three Wallingford soldiers died in captivity. One died at Andersonville Prison, GA, one at Libby Prison, Richmond, VA, and one at Florence, SC.

THIRTY-FIVE WERE WOUNDED

The first Wallingford soldier wounded was Private William A. Thrall of Company A, 10TH Connecticut. He was wounded at Roanoke Island, NC on February 8, 1862 and recovered from his wound. Four Wallingford soldiers died from a wound received during the war.
