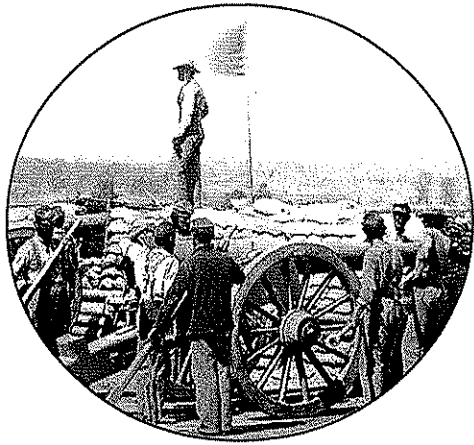

More soldiers credited Waterbury were listed as casualties (21) on this day than on any other day of the war. One soldier was killed, 6 were wounded, 9 were captured and 5 were wounded & captured in the 14TH and 20TH Connecticut. One of the wounded died.

The date May 3, 1863 ranks 3RD for total casualties (577) (36 killed, 1 missing, 138 wounded, 372 captured, 29 wounded & captured) for a single day for the State of Connecticut. The most casualties were at Chancellorsville, VA (556). The other casualties were at Providence Church Road, VA (12), Suffolk, VA (6), Port Hudson, LA (2) and Fredericksburg, VA (1).

The Battle of Chancellorsville (May 1-3, 1863) ranks 2ND for total casualties (677) for an engagement for the State of Connecticut. The most intense fighting developed on May 3. Waterbury also had 4 casualties on May 2.

The Battle of Chancellorsville with 25 total casualties for Waterbury was the highest number of casualties for any single engagement of the war for the city.

The Battle of Chancellorsville was an enormous defeat for the more than 70,000 Union soldiers who had moved against the flank and rear of 40,000 Confederate soldiers. Unfortunately, the Union Army had pulled back and had gone on the defensive around Chancellorsville. The Confederate victory was tainted however, by the loss of Confederate Major General "Stonewall" Jackson.

**THIRTY-NINE WERE KILLED AND
THREE WERE MISSING**

The first Waterbury soldier killed was Corporal Cornelius Bailey of Company B, 1ST Connecticut Squadron Cavalry. He was killed at Washington, DC on October 21, 1861 by a kick from a horse.

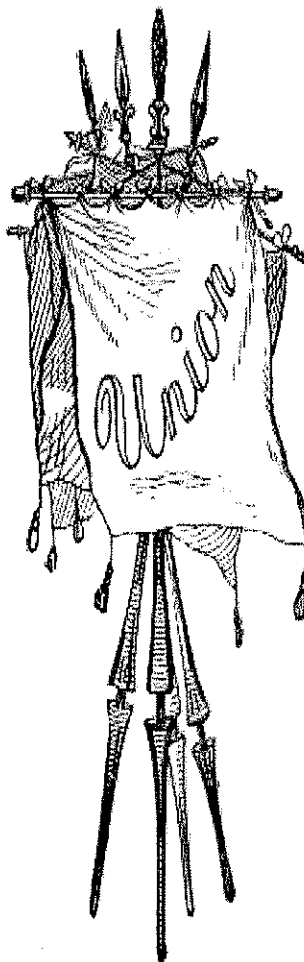
**ONE HUNDRED-ELEVEN WERE

The first Waterbury soldier wounded was Private William H. Langdon of Company A, 5TH Connecticut. He was wounded at Winchester, VA on May 25, 1862 and recovered from his wound. Eight Waterbury soldiers died from a wound received during the war.
