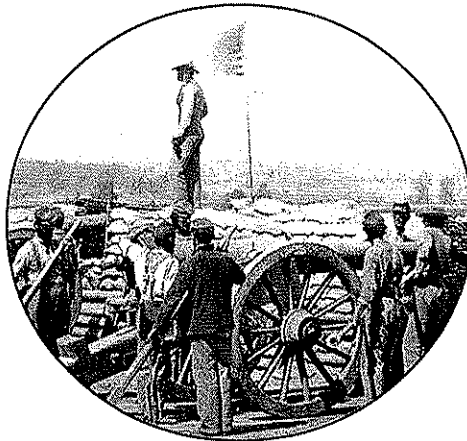

THE MOST IMPORTANT DAY
OF THE CIVIL WAR

APRIL 20, 1864

PLYMOUTH, NC

THE CONFEDERATE PLAN

ENDED WHEN 2,800 UNION
TROOPS SURRENDERED
THE CITY

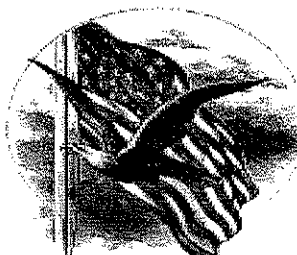
More soldiers credited to Windsor were listed as casualties (7) on this day than on any other day of the war. Seven soldiers in the 16TH Connecticut were captured. Five of them eventually died in prison.

The date April 20, 1864 ranks 6TH for total casualties (433) (1 killed, 2 missing, 12 wounded & captured, 418 captured) for a single day for the State of Connecticut. All of the casualties were at Plymouth, NC.

The Battle of Plymouth (April 20, 1864) ranks 9TH for total casualties (433) for an engagement for the State of Connecticut. Nearly half of all soldiers captured at Plymouth died in Southern prisons

The Battle of Plymouth with 7 total casualties for Windsor was the highest number of casualties for any single engagement of the war for the town.

When Confederate General Robert Hoke surrounded and captured the Union garrison at Plymouth, NC the Southern victory was the first in this military arena in quite some time. With aid from the two-gun ironclad *Albatross* the Confederates were able to take advantage of the lack of suitable Union gunboats.

FIVE WERE KILLED AND ONE WAS MISSING

The first Windsor soldier killed was Private Henry W. Allyn of Company B, 1ST Connecticut Squadron Cavalry. He was killed at Aldie, VA on June 17, 1863.

TWELVE WERE CAPTURED

Six Windsor soldiers died in captivity. Three died at Andersonville Prison, GA, two at Florence, SC, and one died at Salisbury, NC.

TWENTY-SEVEN WERE WOUNDED

The first Windsor soldiers wounded were Sergeant James Shinners, Corporal William D. Warriner and Private Joseph J. Jones of the 8, 11, 16TH Connecticut. They were wounded at the Battle of Antietam on September 17, 1862. Corporal Warriner died and Private Jones died in Andersonville Prison, GA after being captured later in the war at Plymouth, NC. Three Windsor soldiers died from wounds received during the war.
