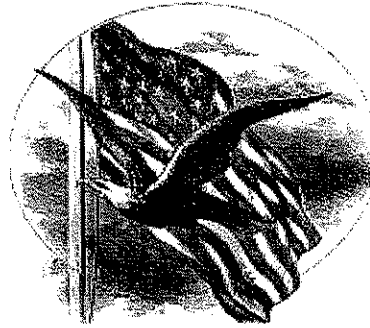
More soldiers credited to Woodstock were listed as casualties (38) on this day than on any other day of the war. Three soldiers were killed, 31 were captured, and 4 were wounded & captured in the 18TH Connecticut. One of the wounded soldiers died.

The date June 15, 1863 ranks 2ND for total casualties (595) (23 killed, 11 wounded, 520 captured, 41 wounded & captured) for a single day for the State of Connecticut. There were 592 casualties at Winchester, VA and 3 casualties at Port Hudson, LA.

The Second Battle of Winchester (June 13-15, 1863) ranks 5TH for total casualties (592) for an engagement for the State of Connecticut. The most intense fighting developed on June 15. Woodstock had all its casualties on that day.

The Second Battle of Winchester with 38 total casualties for Woodstock was the highest number of casualties for any single engagement of the war for the town.

Winchester was one of the most contested locations in the Civil War. It changed hands seventy-two times.

TWELVE WERE KILLED AND ONE WAS MISSING

The first Woodstock soldier killed was Private Peter Fornnia of Company H, 11TH Connecticut. He was killed at New Bern, NC on March 14, 1862.

FIFTY-EIGHT WERE CAPTURED

Six Woodstock soldiers died in captivity. Four died at Andersonville Prison, GA, one at Florence, SC and one died at Libby Prison, Richmond, VA.

**FORTY WERE WOUNDED**

The first Woodstock soldiers wounded were Privates Henry C. Dodge, William H. Clements, Charles H. Moore and George D. Pike of the 11TH Connecticut. They were wounded at the Battle of Antietam, MD on September 17, 1862. Privates Dodge and Pike died from their wounds. Ten Woodstock soldiers died from a wound received during the war.
